Juliet's father forces her into a marriage with Count Paris To avoid this marriage, Juliet takes a potion, given her by the friar, that makes her appear dead The friar will send Romeo word to be at her family tomb when she awakes The plan goes awry, and Romeo learns instead that she is dead In the tomb, Romeo kills himself Juliet

events—Tybalt murders Mercutio, Romeo is enraged and kills Tybalt, he is banished from Verona, and because Romeo and Juliet cannot communicate, there is confusion and they ultimately die Paris a young count He is a handsome, pleasant young man and cousin of the Prince He seems to truly care for Juliet and mourns when she dies
